What is stormwater?

- Runoff: rain water and melting snow
- Flows to stream, river or wastewater plant
- Can be combined with wastewater
- EPA classifies it as a pollutant because it contains elements harmful to the environment, such as motor oil, road salt and animal waste.





What are stormwater costs?

- Cleaning catch basins & pipes between them
- Maintaining pipe rights-of-way
- Engineering/analysis to properly locate and size stormwater pipe



- Replacing old pipe & installing new pipe
- Its fair share of GAUD overhead costs, including operating expenses, retirement costs, et al.



Stormwater costs (continued)

- Collecting and treating combined storm/ wastewater overflow to comply with EPA regulations.
 - Wastewater in Augusta is combined with stormwater.
 - When it rains, flows increase dramatically.
 - Wastewater pipes are sized to also convey stormwater in some cases, so wastewater customers are also stormwater customers.



Why is a rate increase needed?

All costs have risen in the nearly six years since the last rate increase (2011). The 15% rate hike equates to an annual increase of less than 2.5%. Without it, GAUD stormwater cash flow would soon be negative:





Cash flow scenario





Stormwater rate increase: Residential

Increase of 15% starting with July invoice:

 Typical homeowner will pay for one ERU*: \$8.68/month, up from \$7.55 per month (annual increase of \$13.56).

*Equivalent Residential Unit, = 2,700 sq. ft. of impermeable area

(NOTE: Stormwater rates apply only to Augusta; Hallowell pays for stormwater as part of its taxes.)





Stormwater rate increase: Commercial

Increase of 15% starting with July invoice:

 Businesses, City of Augusta and State of Maine will pay 15% more for ERUs* and catch basins (rising from \$46.27 to \$53.21 per month).



*Equivalent Residential Unit, = 2,700 sq. ft. of impermeable area
